

A Declaration for A More Perfect Union

to Honor Civility of Conduct, Transparency for the Blessings of Liberty



May 1, 2017

BE IT WRITTEN AND DECLARED that We, George Washington and thirty-eight other signatories, of these most important and sustaining signatories to the United States of America's Constitution on Day 220, on the Month of September, in 1787, the Year of our Lord with the God Almighty Preside.

The Preamble

"We the People of the United States, in Order to form a more perfect Union, establish Justice, insure domestic Tranquility, provide for the common Defense, promote the general Welfare, and secure the Blessings of Liberty to ourselves and our Posterity, do ordain and establish this Constitution for the United States of America."

The National Leadership Center for Excellence and our American Civility Forum of Civitas, pledge to advance the emphasis of A More Perfect Union to honor Domestic Tranquility. To this end, we shall honor our Constitution in these most important purposes and practices to promote the general welfare and to secure the Blessings of Liberty to ourselves and our Posterity. In this we shall honor our founding fathers sacred law as our personal inheritance and promise to advance a more perfect union under all conditions of war and peace. In so practicing, let us join together as one national community of practicing leaders of civility and justice living to be an energy for a more perfect union. In this we make reflection regarding the on-fourth right Article for 2018 commitments and future engagements.

Our Declaration's "We the Civilians" Cultural and Civility Leadership Article of Engagement are...

Article 1. We hereby do affirm to act for the Day of the America to be observed and observed a National Day of Civility, Loyalty and Trust.

Article 2. We hereby do affirm to preserve in the American Civility that it is to be established in the great State of Michigan.

Article 3. We hereby do affirm to be engaged to be a member in the League of the 1787 A More Perfect Union and the 1787 General Assembly.

Article 4. We hereby do affirm to be engaged in knowing our Constitution and its fundamental principles in our 50 states.

Article 5. We hereby do affirm to be engaged in Civility, Respect, Engagement, Integrity and Justice Leadership Training.

Article 6. We hereby do affirm to be engaged in honor and respect of A More Perfect Union of Justice, Achievement, Peace.

Article 7. We hereby do affirm to contribute to our country's peace and leadership principles through our national day of signature.

Article 8. We hereby do affirm to be engaged in our national unity as a constitutional system that of justice and justice.

Article 9. We hereby do affirm to be engaged in the most important relationship that - with our nation.

Be it enacted, that we the 100 undersigned wish to offer our very best of leadership for the service of our Declaration for A More Perfect Union. We act upon this in order to contribute our full self-fulfillment of our purpose for the common good - as our capabilities truly possible. All signatures are final and shall be complete on or before September 1, 2017. It shall be officially recorded that the General Assembly shall meet in Philadelphia Constitution Day, September 17, 2017 and every year thereafter for the very purpose of honoring our Constitution's Preamble for A More Perfect Union.

With our very best of intentions we shall lead by example as servant leaders and cultural architects in the shaping Community of Progress - The American Leadership Forum of Civitas. We do as citizens endeavor a higher endeavor to truly reflect the design and successful implementation of a working one relationship system dedicated to a better and more lasting future.
